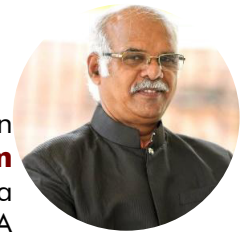

Prof. Gurmeet Singh

Vice-Chancellor

He is a renowned academic administrator and an internationally reputed expert in the field of Corrosion Science and Smart Materials. He had been on high-level Committees of the UGC, DBT, CSIR, and several other public institutions. Prof. Singh has served as a Chair Professor at Lunghwa University, Taipei, where he was specially invited to start collaborative research. He was a visiting scientist to Hungary and Japan and has been on academic assignments to Germany, Italy, Australia, Singapore, Korea, Thailand and Kenya. He is also currently a Visiting Professor at Japan Advanced Institute of Science & Technology (JAIST), Ishikawa, Japan.

An inspiring teacher and mentor of research, Prof. Singh has guided 14 MPhil and 50 Ph.D. scholars, several of the resulting contributions have received accolades and best paper awards at international/national conferences. At the time of moving to Pondicherry University, Prof. Singh was personally supervising 9 major R&D projects worth over Rs 7.5 crores. With about 150 research papers of which a majority are in

high-impact international journals, Prof. Gurmeet Singh is also among the most cited of the scientists in his field. An off-decorated academician, Prof. Singh has received, among other honors, the Meritorious Contribution Award, the Annapurna Award, Membership of The Royal Society of Chemistry, London, and Fellowship of SAEST and The Electrochemical Society of India.

He has joined the Defence Institute of Psychological Research under DRDO in 1989 as Scientist 'B' and since then has been associated with projects in the area of Experimental and Human Engineering, Aviation Psychology and Environmental Psychology. His involvement has brought out various tests and aids for psychological adaptation of Troops in High Altitude Siachen Glacier areas and for scientific teams in Antarctica. The design and development of tools and systems for the selection of armed forces personnel has been a special forte. As Programme Director for the 'Series Production of Computerized Pilot Selection System (CPSS), unique to a life sciences lab, he made a landmark achievement in the field.



The agreement between the Indian Air Force and DRDO with respect to the Computerized Pilot Selection System marked DIPR's exceptionality as a Life Sciences Lab. His vast experience and the credentials have led him to be an invited and esteemed member in Human Engineering Panel and Aeronautical Development Research Board. To his credit he has participated many International and National Conferences, Seminars and Workshops held at various Organizations. Prof. Barbara Hanfstingl

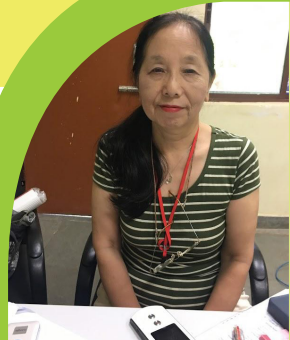
Professor, School of Education,

Instruction to the Paper Presenters

Proposals are invited for symposia, workshops, individual paper, and poster presentation related to the psycho-socio issues of children from different ethnicities, races, languages, religions, abilities, and disabilities.

Workshop on School Psychology (60 minutes): The purpose of this workshop is to enable a practitioner, researcher, or other educational professional/teachers to present specific innovative techniques, methods and tools for psychologists from a practical point of view in relation to the conference theme. This is a one hour workshop on School Psychology Competencies.

Symposium (90 minutes): Presentations to be submitted together on a specific topic. This is a talk presentation style. Each integrated symposium generally includes a maximum of four (4) presentations on a common topic based on the conference theme and subthemes. Multi-disciplinary panels are welcome. Kindly note that the convener of the symposium must be a psychologist.

Papers (20 minutes including questions from participants): The purpose of a paper presentation is to present research findings and innovative practices. Papers should be related to the theme and sub-theme of the conference, and report on recent developments. Abstract should be around 150-250 words and should include aim, methodology and results.

Publication of Papers: Full paper should be around 5000 words including tables and references. APA 7th edition format for referencing should be followed. The peer-reviewed selected papers will be published in the INSPA Journal of Applied and School Psychology (April 2023 Volume 5, Number 2) or International Journal of Asia Pacific School Psychology (July 2023 Volume 5 Number 2). If the paper is suitable for publication, a separate letter will be sent for acceptance of papers

Posters: The purpose is to offer a visual display of presentation, in an attractive way on a given poster space. Presenters should also offer additional information (leaflets, handouts, or brochures) to take away. The normal size of the poster is 30 x 20 inches size. Best Posters will be selected and cash prizes will be awarded.
